#### The importance







#### Public Revenue, in € per capita, 2023
















#### Public Revenue, in % of the GDP, 2023



### Local Government Revenue, in € per capita























#### **Local Government Revenue as % of Public Revenue**







#### **Local Government Revenue as % of GDP**




















#### Local Revenues as a share of Total Public Revenues & GDP














# Local Government Revenue in South-East Europe, in € per Capita





















# Property Tax as % of Total Local Revenue and GDP



# Local Government Expenditure as % of Public Expenditure












#### **Local Government Expenditure as % of GDP**










### Local Government Expenditure in EUR per capita





### Local Government Investements, in € per Capita, 2023


















## Local Government Spending for Salaries, in € per Capita, 2023



# Local Government Investments, in Eur per capita




















### Composition of Local Expenditure, according to the functions of government, in % of total
